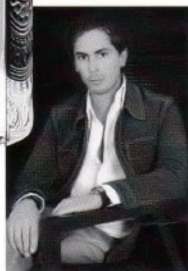


## FAMILY JEWELS

With his open shirt and dark locks, Kilian Hennessy could pass for 19th-century heartthrob Lord Byron. As the grandson of the founder of LVMH group, Hennessy spent his childhood playing in the shadows of cognac barrels, then graduated from the Sorbonne in Paris with a thesis on the semantics of smell. Now, after a stint studying under some of the perfume industry's top noses and marketing fragrances for big-name fashion houses like Armani and Dior, the 35-year-old has concocted his own small batch collection of darkly romantic scents called *L'Oeuvre Noire*, which are exclusive in the United States at Bergdorf Goodman and Aedes de Venustas, New York. Three sets of paired *eau de parfums* for men and women range the olfactory landscape from Damascan plum to Caribbean rum. The black bottles are equally bewitching at \$225 apiece, presented in a black satin-lined lacquer box. Be sure to sample *A Taste of Heaven*, which is redolent of orange blossom and amber and inspired by green absinthe, that notorious artist's aid.
